4 Days in Paris

Quick Jips

- Use the metro for everything
 - Don't waste your money on Ubers or Taxis. Under 2 euros will get you anywhere in the city. The system is composed of metros and RER trains. Rate is the same and changes are free within the city boundaries.
- Pickpocketters are real
 - Do not put anything valuable in your pockets.
 - Make sure your hand is on your backpack or purse at all times.
 - If people approach you to distract you, pick something up in front of you or ask you to sign a form, they are trying to steal from you.
- Etiquette
 - Say Bonjour in all businesses as soon as you walk in. Very rude not to acknowledge people.
 - Tipping is not customary.
 - The customer is never right and service is likely subpar.

Day 1 - Welcome to Paris

- Start your day at a Boulangerie
 - Don't forget to grab a baguette or a croi<mark>ssant for</mark> breakfast.
- First Impressions of Paris
 - Take the metro to the Louvre stop to start exploring this part of town.
 - Walk around the outside of the Louvre Museum but save the inside visit for the last day or a night tour instead.
 - Spend some time in the Jardin Dus Tuileries gardens right in front of the Louvre.
 - Walk down Champs Elysee toward Arc de Triomphe.
- Eiffel Tower
 - Get the first glimpse of the tower at Place du Trocadero.
 - Head to a grocery store to get some picnic supplies.
 - Have a beautiful sunset picnic in the Champ de Mars area.

Day 2 - Busy day exploring the city

- Morning in Latin Quarter
 - Eat breakfast at a nice Parisian cafe.
 - Start your exploring with the stunning Luxembourg Gardens.
 - Walk to Latin Quarter neighborhood right next to the gardens.
 - See the Pantheon which has a nice panoramic rooftop terrace worth stopping at.
- Afternoon near Notre Dame
 - Walk Rue St-Michel towards Rue de la Harpe, and have lunch in this area.
 - Explore the Place Saint Michel touristy but worth seeing.
 - Notre Dame see from the outside, closed due to a tragic fire a couple of years ago.
- Evening in Montemarte and Sacre Coeur
 - Take the metro to Anvers stop.
 - Explore the Montemarte neighborhood artsy and very Parisian.
 - See the sunset by Sacre Coeur church.

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Day 3 - Day in Versailles

- Chateau du Versailles
 - Take the RER-C train to the Palace of Versailles. Will take about an hour or so.
 - Arrive as early as you can and even with a long line, the entry passes by fast.
 - Exploring the Chateau will take a couple of hours.
- Gardens of Versailles
 - Do not skip these magnificent gardens while you're visiting this place.
 - You can walk around, have a picnic or see the farm.
- City of Versailles
 - The city is also a charming little town (although a little touristy) where you can grab a coffee
 or a glass of wine after exploring all the Chateau property.

Nay 4 - Final Stops of Paris

- Museum Options:
 - Louvre: Most popular, very big so have a plan for what you want to see.
 - Musée de Orsay: Old train station, known for beautiful old clock, and impressive art.
 - Musée de l'Orangerie: Impressionist with Monet's waterlilies.
 - Musée Rodin: Rodin's work along with many sculptures.
 - Musée Picasso: Picasso's work, many drawings, not the best collection.
 - Espace Dalí: Mostly Dali's sculptures and some paintings.
 - The Centre Pompidou: Library and museum.
- Shopping time:
 - Galeries Lafayette: Co for the magnificent building alone even if you're not planning on shopping much.
 - Champs Elysees: Famous but crowded and basic.
 - Avenue Montaigne: Serious spenders only.
 - Marais Area: For the budget traveler.
 - Rue De Rivoli: Another shopping area.
- Cruise on the Seine
 - Book a cruise on the river to take you down the Seine River. It has beautiful views and it's an amazing way to see Paris especially if it's your first time there.
 - There are many providers offering a tour or dinner and the excursions are very similar, depending on your budget.

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
